Texas 4-H Wildlife Habitat Education Project State Contest

WHAT IS THE Wildlife Habitat Education Project (WHEP)?

The Texas 4-H Wildlife Habitat Education Project (WHEP) is an interactive program that teaches youth about wildlife, habitat, habitat management, and natural resources stewardship. In addition, life skills such as team work, critical thinking, public speaking, and observation are underlying objectives in this youth development effort. Creating educated and involved stewards of natural resources is the long term goal.

Various practice and competitive contests are associated with this program. Participation is not required in these to be involved in this wildlife study program but often a contest enhances the learning experience of the youth involved. All contests within the state are open to all ages within 4-H membership.

The WHEP State Contest is held annually in a different part of the state so a different ecological region can be explored and studied each year. This contest uses the current <u>WHEP Manual</u> posted on the 4-H Wildlife webpage and the specific Rules and Procedures written and posted for this contest. The contest is designed for each age division in 4-H; Junior, Intermediate, and Senior. The contest is held outdoors in wildlife habitat as described in the Rules and Procedures.

ELIGIBILITY:

Any current 4-H member is eligible to register as a team member or an individual. This contest does not require a participant to qualify in any other way. Each youth contestant must register on their personal family profile.

REGISTRATION PROCESS: March 1 - April 16, 2017

Registration is completed online through 4-H Connect (<u>https://texas.4honline.com</u>). Registration deadline is <u>April 16, 2017</u>. Registration fee per individual youth contestant is \$25.

- Youth Participant: This registration is <u>only</u> for youth who will be contestants in this event.
- **Coach:** This registration is <u>only</u> for coaches of WHEP teams/individuals. This registration is designed for coaches to list their teams by age divisions so that registered youth contestants can be arranged in teams on the official scoring template and be provided for in terms of appropriate answer sheets and materials. There is no registration fee for coaches. Only one coach registration is required per county to list teams.

There will be no lodging or meal accommodations arranged for this contest. All lodging and meals will be the responsibility of the individual county teams. Lunch on Saturday must be available to contestants on site so that time is not lost with families going in separate directions and returning at different times. Participating counties and families are encouraged to pack their own picnic lunches. The contest area is located in a remote area several miles from any town.

Camping is available at the McClellan Creek National Grasslands. Information is found on the webpage link on the front page. Hotels can be found in nearby Pampa, Clarendon, and Amarillo.
