

## 4-H Wildlife Project Practice Contest Wichita County

This Practice Contest is essentially a training for youth and adults in how to compete in various contests within this project. Plan to go to participate in the various contest activities designed to demonstrate what you can expect in the wildlife contests offered through the 4-H Wildlife Project.

Contest formats to be covered include 4-H WHEP Contest, 4-H Wildlife Challenge, and the wildlife contests held at the State Fair and the Houston and Fort Worth livestock shows.

Date: December 16, 2017

The practice contest will start at 10:00 a.m. and end at approximately 4:00 p.m.

Location: Crooked Creek Golf Course, 13975 TX-240, Electra, TX 76360

**Registration:** 4-H Connect (<a href="https://texas.4honline.com/">https://texas.4honline.com/</a>) from November 1, 2017 through December 3, 2017

All youth and all adults planning to participate must register. There is no cost for this event. Lunch will be the responsibility of all participants. The Crooked Creek Golf Course Grill serves traditional grill dishes like hamburgers, chicken strips, sandwiches, and salads, and is the only food service close enough. Plan to eat there or pack a picnic for your group to eat in the training building.

**Contest:** The contests represented will be abbreviated to accommodate the one day format. Following each contest activity, official answers will be given, explained, and discussed. Adults and youth are eligible and encouraged to participate. This is an opportunity to train youth teams and adult coaches in the contest formats. Each contest represented will be described in full. Handouts will be provided to participants to aid in the training. Much of the training will be held in the field. Participants must dress appropriately to be outside and in the weather during the training date.

Not all of the information will be available for every contest at this time or it may not be updated from the previous year's event. Keep checking the webpage regularly for updated information. Any information not available by the time of the training will be covered at the training.
