Entry Requirements

- Enter individually on 4HOnline beginning March 17, 2021 at <https://texas.4honline.com>
- Late Entry Fee - \$25 per contestant in addition to regular fees

District Deadlines

- Registration on 4HOnline by **April 12, 2021**
- Late entry – **April 14-16, 2021** (late fees apply)

Special Accommodations

- Any competitor who requires auxiliary aids or special accommodations must contact the District office at least 2 weeks before the competition or note such needs when registering on 4HOnline.

Entry Classes

- Novice – any shooter, regardless of age, who is in their first year of 4-H shooting (2020-2021).
 - Novice Junior – ages 8 to 13 years
 - Novice Senior – ages 14 to 18 years

- Regular – any shooter who has completed one or more years in the 4-H shooting program.
 - Junior – ages 8-10 years
 - Intermediate – ages 11-13 years
 - Senior I – ages 14-15 years
 - Senior II – ages 16-18 years

Categories and Fees

- **Novice Class Categories and Fees**

○ Trap	25 targets	\$20
○ Skeet	25 targets	\$20
○ Sporting Clays	10 targets	\$20

Register for all 3 events - \$50

- **Regular Class Categories and Fees**

○ Trap	50 targets	\$30
○ Skeet	50 targets	\$30
○ Sporting Clays	50 targets	\$30
○ 5-Stand	50 targets	\$30

Register for all 4 events - \$100

Fee includes one boxed lunch from Texas Tacos. Additional lunches may be purchased on-site.

Tentative Schedule

- Schedule may be modified based upon number of contestants.
- Specific times for each contest will be sent to county agents ONE week before event.
- Facility gates will open at 8:00 a.m.
- Check-in at the registration/help desk between 8:00 and 8:30 a.m.
- Contest and safety orientation will begin at 8:30 a.m.
- Contests will begin promptly at 9:00 a.m.



Social Distancing (information may be modified if requirements change before contest date)

To host this 4-H event, all persons entering any of the contest grounds must comply with the following Texas A&M AgriLife social distance guidelines:

- Persons aged 10 years and above wear a facemask when utilizing any indoor building.
- Maintain social distancing of a minimum of 6 feet.
- Buildings, tables, and chairs will be sanitized before and after use.
- Each person entering any of the contest grounds must submit a completed COVID-19 screening form (see attached).

Questions at Contest

- A help desk will be located at the check-in/registration table at entry to facility.
- Committee members will be wearing a 4-H lanyard and can help provide directions.

- Participants, parents, judges, and agents will have available a QR code to provide feedback and make suggestions to committee. Information at the help desk.

Awards

- Presentation of awards will be held following tabulation of results.
 - 1st – 3rd places will receive a rosette and a prize to be determined by committee.
- Entry via 4HOnline gives permission to the District office to use the participant's name and/or photograph as needed for marketing and promotion purposes.

District 5 Shooting Sports Contestant Rules

Shotgun (Novice class or Regular class individual entry)

Contest

- Each competitor must provide their own ear and eye protection and ammunition.
- Shotguns 12 gauge or smaller must be used.
- Shot size of 7.5, 8 or 9 must be used.
- Disorderly, unsafe or abusive conduct will not be allowed. This type of conduct may lead to disqualification.
- The match director will have final say in all disputes.
