Tentative Schedule

- Schedule may be modified based upon number of contestants.
- Specific times for each contest will be sent to county agents ONE week before event.
- Facility gates will open at 7:45 a.m.
- Check-in at the registration/help desk between 8:00 and 8:30 a.m.
- Contest and safety orientation will begin at 8:30 a.m.
- Contests will begin promptly at 9:00 a.m.

Questions at Contest

- A help desk will be located at the check-in/registration table at entry to facility.
- Committee members will be wearing a 4-H lanyard and can help provide directions.
- Participants, parents, judges, and agents will have available a QR code to provide feedback and make suggestions to committee.

Lunch and Concession Stand

- Complimentary bottled water, tea and coffee will be provided by 5H Shooting Sports in the clubhouse.
- Snacks and other drinks are available for purchase in the clubhouse.
- The Henderson Rifle Club will be providing a delicious lunch as a 4-H club fundraising project. Lunch may be ordered and purchased at the clubhouse window.

Challenges

• When a shooter or coach feels that a match fired where he/she is competing has been improperly evaluated or scored, the shooter may challenge the score. A challenge must be submitted within the challenge time posted.

Protests

- Individuals and/or teams are permitted to call one Protest per match. A competitor may formally protest:
 - \circ Any injustice which he/she feels has been done him/her except the evaluation of a target.
 - The conditions under which another competitor has been permitted to fire.
 - The equipment which another competitor has been permitted to use.
- A protest must be initiated immediately upon the occurrence of the protested incident and the review fee of \$10 submitted with the complaint orally communicated to the Range Officer.
 - If not satisfied with his/her decision, then state the complaint orally to the Match Director.
 - If not satisfied with his/her decision, then file a formal protest with the Event Director, stating all the facts in the case. Such written protest must be filed within 12 hours of the occurrence of the protested incident.
 - The Event Director will form a jury, discuss the facts, decide, and report to the competitor as soon as possible.
 - The protest and result of the protest will only be discussed with the shooter/participant that filed the complaint.

Awards

- Presentation of awards will be held following tabulation of results.
 - \circ 1st 3rd places will receive a rosette and a prize to be determined by committee.
- Entry via 4HOnline gives permission to the District office to use the participant's name and/or photograph as needed for marketing and promotion purposes.

District 5 Shotgun Contestant Rules

Shotgun (Novice class, Regular class, or Adult individual entry)

Entry Classes

- Novice any shooter, regardless of age, who is in their **first year of 4-H shooting (2021-2022)** irrespective if they have shot in a competitive event or not.
 - Novice Junior ages 8 to 13 years
 - Novice Senior ages 14 to 18 years
- Regular any shooter who has completed **one or more years in the 4-H shooting program**.
 - Junior ages 8-10 years
 - Intermediate ages 11-13 years
 - Senior I ages 14-15 years
 - Senior II ages 16-18 years
- Adult must have a registered 4-H youth participant. Adults will be squadded with youth.

Contest

- Each competitor must provide their own ear and eye protection and ammunition.
- Shotguns 12 gauge or smaller must be used.
- Shot size of 7.5, 8 or 9 must be used.
- Disorderly, unsafe, or abusive conduct will not be allowed. This type of conduct may lead to disqualification.
- The match director will have final say in all disputes.

District 5 3-Position Rifle Games Contestant Rules

Rifle (individual entry or team of 3-4 members)

Entry Divisions and Fees (grade by August 31, 2021)

- Junior Grades 3, 4, and 5 \$25
- Intermediate Grades 6, 7, and 8 \$25
- Senior Grades 9, 10, 11 and 12 \$25

Events

- Junior Prone
- Intermediate Prone, standing and kneeling
- Senior Prone, standing and kneeling

Equipment

- Each competitor must provide their own ear and eye protection and ammunition.
- Smallbore rifles (.22 caliber) must be used.
- Targets will be provided.

Contest

- No use of a platform, sandbag, or any other type of rest for Prone position competition. A sling is recommended for stability.
- Rifles brought to the range must be unloaded with bolts open.
- When moving to the line, all rifles must have bolts open with an empty chamber indicator/open bolt indicator in place.
- Disorderly, unsafe, or abusive conduct will not be allowed. This type of conduct may lead to disqualification.
- The match director will have final say in all disputes.

Time Limits

• Each team is permitted one hour to complete their practice and competition shots.

Qualifying for State Rifle Tournament

- The top three Senior age division teams (grades 9-12) at the District-level Rifle contest will advance to state.

Awards

- Team awards for $1^{st} 3^{rd}$ places in each age division will be presented.
- High point team award for each position in each age division will be presented.
- Overall individual high point award will be presented.

District 5 Smallbore Rifle Silhouette Rules

Rifle (individual entry)

Entry Divisions and Fee (grade by August 31, 2021)

- Junior Grades 3, 4, and 5 \$15 per person
- Intermediate Grades 6, 7, and 8 \$15 per person
- Senior Grades 9, 10, 11 and 12 \$15 per person

Events

- Junior 20-shot course
- Intermediate 30-shot course
- Senior 40-shot course

Equipment

- Each competitor must provide their own ear and eye protection and ammunition.
- Smallbore rifles (.22 caliber) must be used.
- Metal silhouettes will be provided.
- Ammunition Any standard factory solid point (no hollow point) .22 load is permitted. Hot, hyper-velocity loads are not permitted. Only standard .22 rimfire ammunition commercially catalogued as .22 Short, .22 Long or .22 Long Rifle ammunition with an overall length of not more than 1.1 inches, a lead or alloy bullet no larger than .23 inches in diameter and a weight of no more than 40 grains may be used.
- An empty chamber indicator (or open bolt indicator OBI) is required in all 4-H competition to indicate the bolt is open.

Contest

- Rifles brought to the range must be unloaded with bolts open.
- When moving to the line, all rifles must have bolts open with an empty chamber indicator/open bolt indicator in place.

- Disorderly, unsafe, or abusive conduct will not be allowed. This type of conduct may lead to disqualification.

Targets

- Smallbore Rifle Silhouettes are standard 1/5 scale steel chickens, pigs, turkeys, and rams as specified in section 4 of the NRA Rifle Silhouette Rules.
 - Seniors shoot a standard 40-shot course of fire, including ten chickens at 40 yards, ten pigs at 60 yards, ten turkeys at 77 yards and ten rams at 100 yards.
 - Intermediates shoot a 30-shot course of fire, including ten pigs at 40 yards, ten turkeys at 60 yards and ten rams at 77 yards.
 - Juniors fire a 20-shot course, including ten pigs at 40 yards and ten rams at 60 yards.

Time Limits

• Firing time - 2 ¹/₂ minutes will be allowed for each bank of five targets.

Awards

- Presentation of awards will be held following tabulation of results.
 - \circ 1st 3rd places will receive a rosette and a prize to be determined by committee.

Rifle (individual adult entry)

Fee

- There is NO fee to participate in this learning opportunity, however, registration is required. Adults without a 4HOnline profile, may contact Carolyn Walton via email at <u>carolyn.walton@ag.tamu.edu</u> no later than May 3rd to register.
- At the end of the ½ hour clinic, registered participants will have the opportunity to use smallbore rifles to practice firing at the silhouettes.

Equipment

- Each participant must provide their own ear and eye protection and ammunition.
- Smallbore rifles (.22 caliber) must be used.
- Metal silhouettes will be provided.
