Entry Requirements

- Enter individually on 4HOnline beginning **April 1, 2022** at <https://texas.4honline.com>
- Registration Fee – \$10 per participant
 - Three independent Shows (Qualifying, Futurity, and Open Classes) will be offered with individual classes. See attached show schedule for classes offered and fees associated.
 - An optional Stock Horse Clinic will be offered the day before the show. See page 7 for information.
- It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to read and follow the rules/information outlined in this document as well as the rules for the Texas 4-H Horse Show, which can be downloaded from <https://animalscience.tamu.edu/livestock-species/equine/state-4h-show/>



District Deadlines

- Registration on 4HOnline by **May 3, 2022**
- **Late entries: May 4 – 6, 2022 - \$25 in addition to regular registration fee**

Participation

- Contestants must be active 4-H members enrolled in a Texas 4-H Youth Development county program in District 5.
- Contestants must also be academically eligible (according to UIL rules) to compete on the day of the contest.

- Eligibility is determined by a participant's grade as of September 1, 2021. Contestants must be between the ages of 8 and in the 3rd grade through 12th grade. All ages will compete against one another in all classes. Age divisions for special awards are as follows:
 - Junior Grades 3-8
 - Senior Grades 9-12
- Entry via 4HOnline gives permission to the District office to use the participant's name and/or photograph as needed for marketing and promotion purposes.
- Walkie-talkies, cell phones, earpieces and the like may not be used by contestants during competition. Exception: Aids for the hearing impaired.

Horses Entered

Only horses validated through the appropriate online certification and, subsequently, through the state 4-H horse office, by **May 1, 2022**, are eligible to enter and compete in the district and state 4-H horse show competition. Note criteria for minimum class sizes.

Special Accommodations

Any competitor who requires auxiliary aids or special accommodations must contact the District office at least 2 weeks before the competition or note such needs when registering on 4HOnline.

Exhibitor Packets

Individual contestants are required to pick up their contestant packet at the registration area prior to showing.

Awards

- Rosettes will be presented to 1st – 3rd places in each class and age division.
- Rosettes will be presented to 1st – 5th places in the Speed Division.
- Participation ribbons will be presented to those not receiving a rosette.
- Awards will be given to the following class winners: Halter, Hunter Flat, Judged Western, Speed, Futurity, Roping and Stock Horse.
- Award to exhibitors of Champion and Reserve Champion Mare
- Award to exhibitors of Champion and Reserve Champion Gelding
- Award to each Division Champion in the Judged Western, Speed Division, Hunter Division, Roping Division and Stock Horse Division. Two age divisions (Junior and Senior) will be recognized in each division. Awards will be based on the official class placings. No awards or points will be given to disqualified participants.

Photography Area

- A photo back-drop area for horse and rider will be available outside the arena for those desiring to take their own photographs of participants.

Rule Knowledge

- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to know the rules of competition which include tack and equipment requirements.

Coggins

In accordance with Texas state law, a negative EIA (Equine Infectious Anemia, also called “Coggins” or “Swamp Fever”) test is required within the previous 12 months prior to entering a show. To check in and receive your show credentials, you must have and present to show officials a current negative EIA test that is valid through the show. If a current EIA certificate (or Coggins) is not provided at check in, the horse(s) will not be allowed to unload.

Working Order

The working orders for performance classes are drawn randomly and printed in the official show schedule. Events are scheduled in the most logical sequence considering contestants showing a horse in more than one event.

Participants and their parents are responsible for keeping track of working orders and being in line or in the makeup area when their run or heat time arrives. **If participants miss their heat or run, they will forfeit their run in the class missed unless the class superintendent is notified of an unpreventable emergency before the time to work has passed.**

Like Conditions

All participants will compete under the following like conditions:

- For speed events, up to four (4) people will be working inside the arena
- Spectators will be allowed to sit anywhere in the stands
- Announcers will make announcements as needed
- Events will be managed consistently and the same as for any other show

Riding and Working Limitations

Only participants may ride or work horses on the show grounds and must be wearing a contestant back number.

Dogs

For the safety of individuals and their horses, all dogs on the show grounds must be on a leash no longer than 6'. Violators may be subject to dismissal from the show. In consideration of exhibitors' safety, please keep dogs outside of show arenas and stands.

Stalls and Shavings

Stalls and extra shavings can be reserved and paid for on 4HOnline. Costs are outlined below. Stalls will be assigned by county. If you would like to be stalled next to another exhibitor, both parties must complete the STALLING REQUEST section located on 4HOnline. The payment for a stall on 4HOnline includes three bags of shavings. Additional shavings can also be ordered with your entry on 4HOnline and can be purchased on site via check.

2022 District 5 Horse Shows

1. Qualifying Show

Show Description. The show will offer classes in divisions that make up the Qualifying Show. A 4-H member must show in at least one class in each Division entered in order to qualify for the State 4-H Horse Show (see state rules for further explanation). Qualifying classes and entry fees are listed below. For all Qualifying Show classes, a minimum of 5 entries per age division are required to make a class.

Speed Event Gates

For speed events, except the Stakes Race, participants and horses will be allowed to exit through the alley. A gate will be closed behind the alley between it and the barn. However, if a participant wishes to have the arena gate closed during his run, he must let the class coordinators/gate men know. It will be the option of the participant to run with an open or closed gate.

2. Futurity Division Show

Show Description. A futurity project horse must be shown at this show in order to qualify for a futurity class at the State 4-H Horse Show. Only horses nominated through the state futurity online certification and, subsequently, through the state 4-H office, by May 1, 2022 are eligible to enter and compete in the district and state 4-H horse show competition. You will need to have entered your horses on 4HOnline and have them certified for you to have options for entering them into the District Horse Show.

Note: Participants must be at least 12 years of age and 6th grade on September 1, 2021 to enter this division.

3. Open Classes Show

Show Description. For all Open Flat (Stock Horse Division and Cow Boxing) classes, a minimum of 5 entries per age division are required to make a class. For all Open Roping classes, a minimum of 5 entries per age division are required to make a class.

- Members do not have to compete in Open classes at the District Horse Show to show in these classes at the State Horse Show. They must, however, meet the entry deadline. Classes and entry fees are listed in the chart below.
- All roping events at the District Horse Show will be conducted with the “back gate” closed.
- Since Cow Boxing is a non-division class, only class awards will be given.

Team Roping

Each 4-H member enters as an individual and may only enter once. The partner can be any 4-H member who is also entered in the Team Roping class and may help as many times as needed.

Ranch Sorting

4-H members participating in this event can be a member of only one team and that team will compete with one go-round with the opportunity to advance to a final round. All team members must be listed on each entry on 4HOnline and each team sorter's entry must be consistent in listing team partners. Teams can be formed from different counties. "Unknown", "To Be Determined", or similar wording is not acceptable, and in such case the entry will be returned to the member for corrections. See state rules for specific information. There will be a 1st go and finals.

Roping Go's

Team Ropers, Calf Ropers and Breakaway Ropers will have one full go, with no more than 10 entries advancing to a final round.

2022 District 5 Stock Horse Clinic

Show youth are invited to participate in a Stock Horse Clinic the day before the show. Youth will have the opportunity to learn and improve their skills in Stock Horse Horsemanship and Trail. Clinician is Nancy Cahill.
