has renamed their competition to the Ronald Barlow Memorial 3-D Archery Meet to celebrate his life and the positive impact he made on 4-H youth.

Date

Saturday, April 27, 2024

Open statewide to all enrolled 4-H youth and adults with youth participant.

Entry Requirements

- Enter individually on 4HOnline beginning March 15, 2024 at https://texas.4honline.com
- Contest Fee \$30 per contestant + \$5 target fee* =
 \$35 total fee per equipment class
- Late Entry Fee \$60 per contestant + \$5 target fee*
 = \$65 total fee per equipment class



*Target Fee: this fee will be collected for the specific purpose of aiding in covering the costs of maintenance, repair, and replacement of the large number of 3D targets necessary to hold this event. Target Fees collected will only be used for this purpose.

Entry Divisions (grade by August 31, 2023)

Junior Grades 3, 4, and 5
Intermediate Grades 6, 7, and 8
Senior Grades 9, 10, 11 and 12

Note: Youth may register for this event to shoot up one age division, if desired.

Special Accommodations

• Any competitor who requires auxiliary aids or special accommodations must contact the District office at least 2 weeks before the competition or note such needs when registering on 4HOnline.

Golf Carts/Buggies

- You are welcome to bring a golf cart or buggy to travel from station to station. Motorized vehicles will need to stay on the road and remain out the designated target ranges.
- Targets are stationed within walking distance of each other. Boots that can get wet or muddy are recommended.

Warm-up/Practice Field

- Warm-up before the match, on the practice range behind the main building, between 8:00 and 9:00 a.m. Adult supervision is required.
- During tabulation of the scores, registered participants may use the targets to practice their archery skills. Adult supervision is required.



Lunch

One meal ticket for a hamburger basket with all the trimmings, chips, cookie and bottled water will be provided to each registered participant. Additional meal tickets may be purchased for \$8.00 a ticket when registering on 4HOnline. A very limited number of additional lunch tickets may be purchased on-site.

District 5 3-D Archery Contestant Rules

Archery (individual entry)

Entry

- Enter as an individual youth or adult on 4-H Online.
- Youth may register to shoot up one age division, if desired.

Equipment

- Each competitor must provide their own bow and arrows.
- Class Options:
 - o Traditional/Recurve/Longbow
 - Compound Aided
 - NASP Genesis® Barebow
- 3-D targets of deer, wolf, turkey, rabbit, alligator, squirrel, dinosaur, boar, pigs and more will be provided.

Archery Rules

- 1. Texas 4-H Archery Rules will be followed except as noted in these contest rules. Texas 4-H Archery rules will be used to structure this event.
- 2. All entries must be submitted through 4-H Online by individual 4-H members within the Registration Period. There will be no on-site registration.
- 3. Participants will be randomly assigned to a group of 5 or less people of varying age divisions. Registered adult participants will shoot with the same group in which their child is assigned.
- 4. Targets will consist of up to thirty (30) 3-D targets of varied species and size.
- 5. Youth archers will take one recorded shot at each 3-D station. It will be a staggered start. Adult archers will take one recorded shot at each 3-D station.
- 6. Distances to each target will vary based on age division, however, they will be an "unknown" distance. Each target station will have four color-coded stakes (blue, red, white, and orange) to serve as shooting points for each age division (blue, red, and white for youth and orange for adults).
- 7. Scoring will be based a point system and on the diagram shown below:
 - a. 12 points designated "bullseye" x-ring
 - b. 10 points Inside of Heart ring
 - c. 5 points Inside of Lung ring
 - d. 1 point If target is hit anywhere outside of the scoring rings
 - e. 0 points If target is missed completely



- This line represents the "Core" (foam insert) of the target and is a removable piece that does not represent any score.
- This line represents the "Vital-Ring". It may appear inside or outside the "Core."
- The largest ring is the "Heart-Ring."
- The center smallest ring would be the "X-Ring". The other similar rings in and out of the Heart-Ring are not considered the X-Ring.

This is only an example. Shapes/locations of scoring rings may vary between targets. The X-Ring, Heart-Ring, and Vital-Ring will only be those that are located in the actual "heart area." Some target manufacturers include multiple "kill" zones. Those will not be considered scoring rings for

- f. There will be one set of scorecards per target, with an adult group leader acting as scorekeeper. Scores and totals of each end should be verified by each shooter before arrows are touched or removed from the target.
- g. All additions on the scorecard will be done by the scorers ONLY. This will be strictly enforced.
- h. Any question of scoring should be resolved before any arrow is touched or removed from the target.
- i. ALL SCORECARDS SHALL BE SCORED WITH THE END SCORE AND THE RUNNING SCORE BEFORE LEAVING THE TARGET AT THE CONCLUSION OF EACH END.
- 8. Bow classes will include Traditional/Recurve/Longbow, Compound Aided, and NASP Genesis ® Barebow. Texas 4-H Archery Rules define and govern each division. A brief description is provided below:
 - a. Traditional/Recurve/Longbow no magnified sights, no wheels, or releases are permitted. It must be longbow or recurve design only.
 - b. Compound Aided use of sights, releases, stabilizers are permitted. Design must include an axel and wheel (cam).
 - c. NASP Genesis ® Barebow—must be stock Genesis ® bow (bare). Arrows must be unmodified Genesis 30" arrows. Arrows should say Easton 1820 30" to match Texas 4-H rules.

Awards

- An award ceremony will take place after lunch in the main building.
- Individual awards for $1^{st} 3^{rd}$ places in each age division will be presented. Youth archers placing 1st in each age division will receive a rosette and a prize to be determined by committee.
- Overall individual high point award will be presented youth in each age division and adult participant.
- One overall high point Senior age division youth will be presented a special handmade knife by a local artesian knife-smith.
