- Get to know each other ice breaker and team-building games.





What is Lab?

- Senior Leadership Lab is held annually for 4-H members who are in or are entering 8th grade in the fall of 2025 (13 years minimum) through high school.
- The event is designed to prepare District 5 4-H members for various leadership roles at the county, district, and state levels.
- Participants gain valuable project knowledge and skills they can take home and implement in their local county 4-H program.
- By combining work and play, activities are designed to explore creativity in leadership roles, enhance teambuilding skills, and develop communication and public speaking skills.
- Members are encouraged to attend and participate in the District 5 4-H Council business meeting as well as be involved in the selection of the officer team for the next 4-H year.
- Encourage your members to come ready to have a great camp experience!

District Council Elections



- The District 5 4-H Council officer elections will be held during Leadership Lab. 4-H members running for an office must meet certain eligibility requirements and submit the appropriate forms to reach the District office by March 28, 2025 (see attached).
- Along with the application form, a leadership history form will be required and scored.
- There will also be a virtual interview scheduled and conducted the week before camp which will be scored.
- These scores along with the popular vote will be used to select the 2025-2026 District 5 4-H Council officers.

Community Service Project

- This year the 2024-2025 District Council Officers are providing opportunities for District 5 families to give back to local organizations that support children in the foster care system and those under the advocacy program care.

Cost

- \$125 fee per 4-H member participating in Leadership Lab during regular registration (February 14-April 1). Late registration is \$175 and is open from April 2-4, 2025.
- All fees must be submitted through 4-H Online.
- Fees include activities, breakfast, lunch, dinner, lodging and a 4-H Leadership t-shirt.
- No fees will be charged for assigned agents assisting with Lab; however, you must register on 4HOnline and complete the required paperwork.



Registration

- No reimbursements will be made after registration has been approved. However, substitutions of the same gender may be made at any time.
- All changes will be made through the District Office.
- Please note that confirmations will not be made until late in the registration process so that changes, if needed, can be made.

Special Accommodations

- Any participant who requires auxiliary aids or special accommodations must contact the
 District office at least 2 weeks before the camp or note such needs when registering on
 4HOnline.
- If your child has dietary restrictions and is unable to eat the meals provided by the camp, be sure to pack other food for breakfast and lunch.

Check-in and Questions

- Follow the posted 4-H yard signs to check-in at the at the St. Luke's auditorium. Check-in between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m.
- Please contact Jheri-Lynn McSwain, District 5 4-H Specialist at 936-332-3662 with questions while your child is at camp. Dr. McSwain will be on-site during the camp.

Required Forms

The following forms are required for youth participation and are required for completion during the registration process on 4HOnline:

- 1. 4-H Camp & Enrichment Program Waiver, Indemnification, and Medical Treatment form
- 2. Health and Safety Statement form
- 3. Parent Guardian Authorization, Wavier, and Consent for Self-Administration of Prescription Medication Participants 15 years of age or older form
- 4. Authorization to Dispense Medication form
- 5. Parent Guardian Authorization, Waiver, and Consent for Over-the-Counter Medication form (this form also includes sunscreen use).
- 6. Lakeview Methodist Camp Waiver form.
- 7. Permission to Drive to Lab (optional only for youth driving themselves see the Transportation section below).

ALL forms must be signed by a parent/guardian and completed. Questions on forms that are NOT APPLICABLE to your child, be sure to indicate by writing NONE or NA so that forms will be noted as complete.



Transportation



- Youth driving themselves or other family members to lab must complete a permission form during registration. Vehicle keys will be collected during check-in and returned at check-out.
- Youth are NOT permitted to drive non-family members to District events/contests.
- Parents or other volunteer leaders are responsible for transporting campers to and from Lakeview Methodist Camp in Palestine.

What to Bring

- Casual, camp-type clothing will be appropriate for 4-H members and agents. We would
 expect the group to wear suitable clothes that will always reflect a favorable 4-H image.
 Any clothing that shows too much skin is not acceptable (i.e. short-shorts or exposed
 undergarments are considered inappropriate). Lab officials will make the final decisions
 concerning whether certain clothing is allowed.
- 4-H t-shirts are recommended. One camp t-shirt will be provided that will be worn on Saturday. Select your size during registration.

Lodging

Youth will be staying in dorm rooms with bunkbed style beds with 15 youth per room. Bed linens/sleeping bag, pillow and towels will need to be brought by each camper. Room assignments will be made upon arrival at camp. Adult chaperones will be housed in the same dorm building.

^{**}Bring a reusable water bottle (thermos type) as filling stations will be available.



Code of Conduct

Youth will be expected to follow the 4-H Youth Code of Conduct signed during 4-H enrollment. In the event the code of conduct is not followed, parent/guardian will be contacted and expected to pick-up their child at designated time to be determined by 4-H Specialist.
